ABOUT THE SHOW

Arsenic and Old Lace takes place in the 1940s at the home of Abby and Martha Brewster. The Brewster sisters are kind and helpful in their community and have recently begun helping lonely strangers...by poisoning them. They have buried twelve strangers in their basement, but they aren't the only ones collecting bodies: their nephew Jonathan is wanted for the murder of twelve people and has undergone several surgeries to make his face unrecognizable, each performed by his assistant, Dr. Einstein. Abby and Martha's web also involves their other two nephews: Mortimer, who is a local theatre critic engaged to the daughter of the minister next door, and Teddy, who thinks he is Theodore Roosevelt. A steady stream of police officers and guests keeps everyone in the Brewster house on their toes and ready to jump into action!

Arsenic is a hilarious comedy that has held onto its classic status because of its zany characters and sharp punchlines.

AUDITIONS/CASTING

Auditions (Sept. 5-6) are a chance for directors to "try out" actors in different roles to find the best fit for the show. Sign up for one audition slot online. Please arrive at least 10 MINUTES EARLY, and be sure to bring a completed audition form/contract. You may not audition without first turning in your form.

Audition materials are available on the CHS Theatre website. Take time to review what is posted there so you may be fully prepared for your audition. centervillehstheatre.com/callbacks.

Callbacks will be held after school on September 7 (being called back is not a guarantee that you have been cast or cut). The callback list will be posted on centervillehstheatre.com/cast. We will send an announcement on ParentSquare when it is ready. Casting decisions are not based on seniority. All casting decisions are final. Since the needs of each show are different, we encourage you to audition again (even if you are not selected for this show) and to be involved in other ways, like set build or costuming.

CHS THEATRE CODE OF CONDUCT

The CHS student code of conduct is in place for all school activities.

Theatre skills are life skills. We want you to be successful both here and in the future. We expect you to:

★ Develop traits that lead to success:

- Collaboration
- Communication
- Responsibility
- Respect for others and our process together

★ Contribute to a process that is free from:

- Bullying/harassment/hazing
- Drug/alcohol use
- Unsafe use of equipment
- Behavior and language that are inappropriate for school

WHAT IS A DIRECTOR LOOKING FOR AT AUDITIONS?

Following are brief descriptions of the criteria that will be considered at auditions and callbacks:

1. **WILLINGNESS TO ACCEPT DECISIONS.** Directors must make decisions in the best interest of the *show*, which may not match your own. Accept these decisions with grace and maturity. In rehearsal, this is called *taking direction*.
2. **POTENTIAL.** Only a few lucky people are born ready to act. The rest of us must be willing to learn and grow with every experience. Directors are also looking for choices that match their vision of the show.

3. CONFIDENCE. Directors want you to be awesome so they can have an awesome cast—they are on your side! Be willing to put forth your best effort in any situation.
4. AVAILABILITY. Check your schedule NOW and list any conflicts on your audition form. We will honor your conflicts and expect you not to add to them. Students who are not passing all of their classes may not participate.
5. TEAM PLAYERS. When a student is late, missing, unprepared, uncooperative, or has a poor attitude, the entire production is affected.
6. “STAGE PRESENCE.” In theatre, actors must have energy and personality, or shows appear lifeless and flat. Projection, speaking clearly, note accuracy (when songs are involved), and vocal and physical expression are part of this, too.

REHEARSALS/SCHEDULE*

Cast members must attend every rehearsal where they appear in the scene. We are willing to work with scheduling conflicts **when they are provided in advance at auditions.** Conflicts are not accepted for “tech week” (the days leading up to the performance, typically the last 2 weeks), performances, and strike (the day after the final performance). When absolutely necessary, rehearsals may be scheduled with twenty-four hour notice. Rehearsals are closed (no spectators).

Cast members who are consistently unprepared or missing from rehearsals will meet with the director, which may result in their removal from the show. You are joining a team, so losing anyone is a major hardship.

HAIR and COSTUMES

Productions are often set in a specific time, place, or style to achieve a “look” that fits a story. Therefore, cast members may be asked to cut or dye their hair and should not make noticeable changes in cut or color without consulting the director. Cast members may be asked to bring personal items (e.g. undergarments, deodorant, hair styling tools, etc.) for use during the production that will be stored in the theatre throughout the week of the show, if not earlier. Some productions require actors to provide their own dance shoes, and each actor must have their own theatrical makeup kit. Financial assistance is available so that these purchases do not prevent anyone from being involved.

CENTERVILLE SCHOOLS ACTIVITY FEE / CHS THEATRE FEE

Centerville Schools requires students who are part of each CHS Theatre production to pay a **\$30 activity fee**. This fee will be applied to your student fees account. CHS Theatre requires all participants (cast and crew) to pay a \$10 participation fee which covers expenses like show materials or meals, for example. **DO NOT LET THIS KEEP YOU FROM JOINING!** If you have concerns about paying, speak with Mr. Hamen as soon as possible.

YOUR DIRECTORS' ROLE

In exchange for your commitment to this production, you may expect equal commitment from your directors, including

- a safe working environment for a fun experience
- rehearsals with feedback to help you shape your role
- acting and technical challenges to use your creativity
- encouragement of students interested in growing as actors, technicians, and leaders

STATEMENT ON FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION FROM THE EDUCATIONAL THEATRE ASSOCIATION

“Theatre tells the stories of who we are. Through communal experiences, plays bring together imagined worlds on stages with actors, sets, lights, costumes, and sound that allow us to witness and reflect on the lives of others—their emotional trajectory of desire, disappointment, conflict, and resolution—whether through a monologue, song, or dance. As an art that reminds us that we are not alone, theatre can promote social discourse and change, prompt joy and sadness, and bring clarity to issues and ideas. No place is theatre’s value and purpose more apparent than on school stages and in classrooms where teachers guide and nurture students through the journey of ‘walking in someone else’s shoes’ and the creation of worlds that could be, that might be.”
